- 08. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded to others in a business or professional relationship.

LIFE SKETCH OF PAUL P HARRIS (1868-1947)

FOUNDER OF ROTARY

Paul Percival Harris, the founder of Rotary and second of six children to George N. Harris and Cornelia Bryan Harris, was born in Racine, Wisconsin on 19 April 1868. He grew at Wallingford, Vermont in the care of his paternal grandparent since the age of three. A man with wide knowledge and varied experience, received Bachelor degree for Physical Culture from the University of Vermont and L.L.B degree form the University of Iowa. He also received honorary LL.D. degree from the University of Vermont. He was married to Jean Thomson Harris, a Scottish girl and a co-member of the Chicago Prairie Club.

Before settling in Chicago in 1896 to practice law, he worked briefly as a newspaper reporter, a business teacher, stock company actor, a cowboy and a salesman for marble and granite. He traveled extensively in the U.S.A. and Europe. One evening when he visited the home of a professional friend, he came across a number of tradesman in their businesses while strolling in the quite neighborhood after the dinner. During this visit, Paul conceived the idea of a club which will bring the professionals from different trades together in a friendly spirit.

On 23 February, 1905, together with Sylvester Schiele, a coal merchant, Gustavus Loehr, a mining engineer and Haram Shorey, a merchant tailor, formed the 1st club and named it 'Rotary' as the members met in rotation at their places of business. As membership grew the idea spread to other cities, neighborhood and across the national boundaries. Paul Percival Harris became the 1st President of the National Association of Rotary Clubs (in 1910) and also of the International Association of Rotary Clubs (later renamed as Rotary International) in the year 1912. Until his death on 27 January 1947, Paul was an active member of Rotary.

Today, the Rotary covers over 220 countries & geographical area with 1.2 million members in over 35,000 Clubs. It has touched the lives of millions in every corner of the world and can rightly claim that the sun never sets in Rotary world.

It's been an immense pleasure for me to be the Editor of 85th Installation Souvenir of the first ever Club of Bengal Rotary Club of Dhaka (RCD) after Kolkata. Our club has seen three political eras, British India, Pakistan and Bangladesh.

We, Rotarians, are committed to work for the benefit of general people both nationally and internationally. I am feeling honoured to mention our activities, some short and long.

Unfortunately, we are going through a difficult time due to the COVID 19 pandemic. It



is known to everyone that Rotary always works for the most disadvantaged people in the community. In spite of many challenges RCD contributed a lot to the COVID affected people by developing collaborative projects with different hospitals and institutes for the COVID-19 affected population. We are happy to say that during Rotary Year 2019-2020, we got the leadership of the Club President Rtn Dr. Niaz Abidur Rahman and his team who played a great role to establish rooms for COVID-19 patients and COVID testing, vaccination and treatment facilities in Kurmitola General Hospital. In addition, RCD organized training for the frontline workers and provided some equipment to the Kuwait Bangladesh Friendship Government Hospital.

As we know, during the pandemic situation many of the staff of offices, factories, restaurants, households lost their jobs. During this critical situation and during lockdowns, RCD distributed food to many of them and to many underprivileged people of the society.

RCD also planted 1040 trees and many other regular projects were implemented through our partners in service. Whole world is uncertain when this pandemic will end. In Bangladesh, the situation is worsening.

Still our club President Rtn Barrister Mohammad Shafayet Ullah continued to put efforts in continuing the projects particularly on COVID-19, that were initiated by his predecessor. Our regular project interventions were hampered/obstructed due to strict enforcement of lockdown in the country. All our regular weekly and other meetings were held virtually through the zoom platform. We could implement very few projects in person.

The most important project that RCD established is a SARS-Cov-2 Testing Laboratory in the National Institute of Cancer Research and Hospital with a global grant. The most exemplary contribution was by Rtn Barrister Shafayet Ullah by raising funds for The Rotary Foundation (TRF). Total funds raised during his time is USD 125,161, of which for USD 12,700 is allocated for Polio vaccine. Our Annual Fund is USD 10,332 and the rest of the amount, USD 70,529, is for the Global Grant projects.

Most remarkable and amazing news is that for the first time a female member became AKS from RCD.

Continuing the tradition of adding success and achievements, our Club President 2021-22 Rtn Abu Nawaz Bhuiya promises a full year of exciting projects for reaching a new height in the 85th milestone of the Club. The COVID-19 situation is currently worsening in the capital city, Dhaka, which means that the sufferings of ten's and thousands of poor and vulnerable people affected by COVID 19 pandemic will only aggravate.

On behalf of the Editorial Board it is my privilege to welcome the Club President, the Board and the members for a very effective and focused Rotary Year 2021-22. I am also taking the opportunity to welcome the Rotary Year 2021-22 District Governor, Governor Elect and Governor Nominee. I wish them success in their endeavour and good luck.

Mehta, an accountant, is chair of the Skyline Group, a real estate development company he founded. He is also a director of Operation Eyesight Universal (India), a Canada-based organization.

Mehta has been actively involved in disaster response and is a trustee of Shelter Box, UK. After the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami, he helped build nearly 500 homes for families affected by the disaster.

He pioneered a program that has performed more than 1,500 life-changing heart surgeries in South Asia. He is also the architect of the TEACH Program, which promotes literacy throughout India and has reached thousands of schools.

A Rotary member since 1984, Mehta has served Rotary as director, member or chair of several committees, zone coordinator, training leader, member of The Rotary Foundation Cadre of Technical Advisers, and district governor. He is also the chair of Rotary Foundation (India).

Mehta has received Rotary's Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Awards.

He and his wife, Rashi, are Major Donors and members of the Bequest Society.

2021-22 Presidential Theme

Rotary International President Shekhar Mehta urged members to become more involved in service projects, saying that caring for and serving others is the best way to live because it changes not only other people's lives, but also our own.

Mehta, a member of the Rotary Club of Calcutta-Mahanagar, West Bengal, India, revealed the 2021-22 presidential theme, Serve to Change Lives, to incoming district governors on 1 February during the Rotary International Assembly. The assembly, a yearly training event for district governors-elect, was originally set to take place in Orlando, Florida, USA, but was held virtually because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Mehta spoke about how participating in service projects through Rotary changed him as a person and made him empathize more with the needs of others. Soon after joining his club, he helped carry out projects that benefited rural communities in India.

Some of the poor conditions he saw in those communities strengthened his commitment to service. "I truly understood the plight of my brethren," he said.

Mehta participated in initiatives that brought artificial limbs to children, clean water and sanitation to homes, and better health care facilities to communities.

"Rotary kindled the spark within me to look beyond myself and embrace humanity," he said. "Service became a way of life for me and I, like many others, adopted the guiding philosophy that 'Service is the rent I pay for the space I occupy on this earth, and I want to be a good tenant of this earth."

Mehta encouraged district governors-elect to lead by example during their term and inspire Rotary and Rotaract members to participate in projects that have measurable and sustainable impacts. He's asking each club to conduct a Rotary Day of Service.

"At the end of your term as district governor, you should feel that because of your leadership, because of your inspiration to Rotarians and Rotaractors, the world has changed for the better because of the service done by them during the year," he said.

Focusing on diversity, membership

For the 2021-22 Rotary year, Mehta wants members to focus their efforts on empowering girls and ensuring their access to education, resources, services, and opportunities so that future generations of women leaders will have the tools they need to succeed. Mehta asked members to use Rotary's belief that diversity, equity, and inclusion is critical in all we do as a compass to guide this work.

"There are many issues that girls face in different parts of the world, and you as leaders will ensure that we try and mitigate the disadvantage of the girl that they may have," he said.

Shekhar Mehta Rotary International President To be able to do more through service, Rotary needs to increase membership, Mehta said. Membership has hovered around 1.2 million for the past two decades. He challenged the incoming governors to be catalysts in their districts to help increase membership to 1.3 million by 1 July 2022. Mehta's Each One, Bring One initiative asks every member to bring one person to join Rotary within the next 17 months.

Increasing membership while also continuing our commitment to eradicating polio, fighting COVID-19, and serving our communities is an ambitious goal. "And that should excite you," Mehta said. "Rotarians love challenges."



Meet the RI President Elect



Jennifer E. Jones, a member of the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland, Ontario, Canada, has been nominated to become Rotary International's president for 2022-23, a groundbreaking selection that will make her the first woman to hold that office in the organization's 115-year history.

Jones will officially become president-nominee on 1 October if no other candidates challenge her.

Jones says she sees Rotary's Action Plan as a catalyst for increasing Rotary's impact.

"As we reflect upon our new strategic priorities, we could have never envisioned that our ability to adapt would become our North Star during what is inarguably the most profound time in recent history," Jones said in her vision statement. "Silver linings rise out of the most challenging circumstances. Using metric-driven goals, I will harness this historic landscape to innovate, educate, and communicate opportunities that reflect today's reality."

As the first woman to be nominated to be president, Jones understands how important it is to follow through on Rotary's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Statement. "I believe that diversity, equity, and inclusion ... begins at the top and for us to

realize growth in female membership and members under the age of forty — these demographics need to see their own reflection in leadership," Jones said. "I will champion double-digit growth in both categories while never losing sight of our entire family."

Jones is founder and president of Media Street Productions Inc., an award-winning media company in Windsor. She was chair of the board of governors of the University of Windsor and chair of the Windsor-Essex Regional Chamber of Commerce. She has been recognized for her service with the YMCA Peace Medallion, the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal, and Wayne State University's Peacemaker of the Year Award, a first for a Canadian. Jones holds a Doctor of Laws (LL.D.).

A current Rotary Foundation trustee, Jones has been a Rotary member since 1997 and has served Rotary as RI vice president, director, training leader, committee chair, moderator, and district governor. She played a lead role in Rotary's rebranding effort by serving as chair of the Strengthening Rotary's Advisory Group. She is the co-chair of the End Polio Now Countdown to History Campaign Committee, which aims to raise \$150 million for polio eradication efforts.

Jones recently led the successful #RotaryResponds telethon, which raised critical funds for COVID-19 relief and was viewed by more than 65,000. Jones has also received Rotary International's Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service. She and her husband, Nick Krayacich, are members of The Rotary Foundation's Arch Klumph Society, Paul Harris Society, and the Bequest Society.

I also extend my eternal gratitude to all the members of Rotary Club Dhaka, who have contributed in

their own unique ways and responded to my calls; together, we were able to donate more than USD 150,000 in the TRF, and additionally was able to contribute in cash, time, and volunteer work, a total of nearlyUSD 15,20,000 worth of projects.

Moreover, we have been extremely fortunate to have the very first AKS in the past 85 years history of Rotary Club Dhaka, in Rtn Mituli Mahbub Hossain AKS, who is the sweet daughter of our beloved late PDG Ali Mahbub AKS, who has also been a proud member of this esteemed and prestigious Club.

At the beginning of the year, my goal was to have a positive growth in membership and also strike a balance in the gender ratio of the members of the Club. During my Presidency, the Club has witnessed a net membership growth of 29%, a female membership growth of 200%, and a rise in the female membership ratiofrom 9% to 21%. I hope for the positive trend to continue, and I dream for Rotary Club of Dhaka to have a female membership ratio of 50% in the near future. I am confident this will have a very positive impact and can work as a strong statement to the Rotary world that Rotary Club of Dhaka believes in action more than words, especially in terms of empowerment and equality.

My year here began with the holy Eid-ul-Adha, for which we arranged 11 (eleven) cows and 03 (three) goats to be sacrificed, the produce of which were

distributed to 1000 (one thousand) destitute families and approximately 4000 (four thousand) underprivileged citizens affected by flood in the regions of Rowmari and adjoining locations.

In addition to the sacrificial meat, we also arranged food bags containing rice, onions, cooking oil, salt, vermicelli, and various other ingredients used for this holy festival. Needless to say, the project was executed successfully, paving our way into this world for more glorious achievements.

Challenges tagged along throughout the year with this dream of Rotary Club of Dhaka in its endeavor to serve humanity; however, the members of the Clubwere more than happy to face every one of them. Eid was over, but the flood was not. As Bangladesh faced the worst flood in history, we launched the Emergency Relief Project to raise funds for individuals affected by the flood.

With the ongoing pandemic of Covid-19, our next project included establishing a Global Grant Project worth nearly USD 100,000 - the RT-PCR laboratory at the National Institute for Cancer Research and Hospital (NICRH), our vision being providing diagnostic facilities to underprivileged Cancer patients, as well as providing Covid testing facilities.

This year, we were fortunate to have 05 Global Grant projects by ourselves and actively participated in 03 additional Global Grant Projects, culminating to a total of 08 Global Grant Projects, which is a milestone in Rotary Club of Dhaka's 85 years of rich history. My heartiest congratulations to each and every member of the Club on achieving this feat.

Our next conquests included the distribution of 50 (fifty) Gas Cylinders, and 650 bags of food items to 650 families from 2 locations in Jamalpur, planting a thousand fruit saplings through the joint Tree Plantation Program, and building 30 houses for 30 distressed and underprivileged families in Gazipur.

History of Rotary Club of Dhaka

84 years of Service to Society

Background History:

Dhaka in the 1930s was a burgeoning city of 120,000 people mostly living in and around the present 'old town' along the Buriganga river. A major city in East Bengal under the British Raj, Dhaka was growing in importance due to the rapid socio-economic and political changes. The economy was

based on trading mostly jute, cotton, tea and spices based on riverine communication. The gentry comprised of officers of the Raj, educationists, professionals, businessmen and aristocrats who mixed well socially that offered an ideal home for a Rotary in this part the planet earth.

Against the background, a group of 17 people met at a meeting held in the Imperial Bank of India Building opposite the Victoria Park (now Bahadur Shah Park) on December 22, 1937 and founded the Rotary Club of Dhaka, the first



Rotary Club in the then East Bengal (and now Bangladesh). The day is observed as 'the Rotary Bangladesh Day'. The meeting was chaired by H R Wilkinson, the Charter President of the Club.

The Cub sponsored by Rotary Club of Calcutta, was chartered on February 26,1938 admitting it to Rotary International (RI) founded in the industrial city of Chicago of USA on February 23, 1905 by PAUL PERCIVAL HARRIS, an attorney, and three of his business acquaintances – GUSTAVUS OHERE, SI VESTER SCHELE AND HIRAM SHOREY. It is the largest international organization of volunteers serving the humanity.

Initial Growth of Rotary Clubs:

Rotary Clubs of Chittagong (1952-53), Narayanganj (1953-54), Khulna (1957-58), Mymensingh (1957-58), Dhaka North (1967-68) and Comilla (1968-69) were the first six Rotary Clubs sponsored by RC Dhaka.

Projects and Programs:

Rotary Dhakain the last 84 years history has executed tens and thousands of projects and programs as Rotary was founded with an idea that Businesses and professional people could join together in fellowship and service to the community, changing the lives of hundreds and thousands of people mainly from the underprivileged community.

The major projects and programs of Rotary Dhaka include –

 Improvement of Dhaka Railway Station in Fulbaria: It was the first Rotary project in the then East Bengal initiated in 1939 by RC Dhaka with the Assam-Bengal Railway.





• Distribution of Relief during Bengal Famine: RC Dhaka

organized relief centers jointly with government for distribution of free food and fuel during the infamous Bengal famine in 1943-44.

100,000 kits for boys and girls in equal numbers from age 5 to 12 from the poorest of the society.



 Rotary Primary School: In 1951-52, RC Dhaka founded the Rotary Primary School in East Rajabazar in Tejgaon, presently running as Rotary Government Primary School. It is the oldest running Rotary Project in Bangladesh.





 Rotary Blind School: The first in the country, was founded in 1956-57 by RC Dhaka. It is the nucleus for a number Drishti Protibondhi Biddalay

(School for the Disabled Eyesight) in the country under the JatyoPrtibondhiUnnayan Foundation (Foundation for the Development of the Disabled).

• Relief Work during 1970 Cyclone: The Rotary responded immediately to 'Great Bhola Cyclone' that struck the coastal area of Bhola and Patuakhali on 12-13 November 1970. An unique seminar was organized, which attracted



worldwide Rotary response in launching the project 'Home for the Homeless' with financial assistance from 'World Community Service' (WCS) program of Rotary and other foreign Rotary Clubs.



- School-cum-cyclone shelters: In 1972-73, the club rehabilitated a large number of people affected by the 1970 cyclone in Char Fashion and built four school-cum-cyclone shelters at Manpura in Bhola, with prefabricated steel structures donated by Rotary Cubs of Japan. Subsequently, hundreds of such school-cum shelters were built along the coastal region by the government participated by a number of Rotary Clubs, donor agencies and NGOs.
- Walkathon Program and Terry Fox Run: From 1978 to 1999 walkathon programs and Terry Fox runs was organized by RC Dhaka jointly with the Canadian High Commission to raise funds for combating cancer.





Rotary Cancer Detection Unit (RCDU)
 was founded in 1980 by RC Dhaka in a

tin-shed in Dhaka Medical College under a MOU signed between Ministry of Health and RC Dhaka.

• National Institute of Cancer Research and Hospital (NICRH): In 1982, the government founded NIRCH the under the MOU with RCDU as the nucleus. In 1985-86 a permanent three-storied building was constructed for NICRH at a cost of 3.5 million taka, raised through the 'walkathon' program. It was the first building for NICRH. In 1986, the NICRH and RCDU was shifted to the permanent building.

The Club supplied lab equipment for NICRH with the support of Rotary Club of Balwyn, Australia. Over one million cancer patients have been treated in the RCDU in the last 40 years.

 Sleeping Kits Distribution (SKD) program: has been organized every year by RC Dhaka since 1983. It is the longest running program of Rotary. The program is funded by Canadian NGO 'Sleeping Children Around the World' (SCAW). Until now (2015-16) over 3.5 million Canadian dollars and 1.5 million takas have been spent for over







- Concentrated Language Encounter (CLE): Modern teaching method under CLE program was launched by RC Dhaka in 1996 with RI 3-H Grantmounting 500,000 USD. The program was supported by Rotary Club of Footscry, RID 9800, Australia and Rotary Foundation. The program was executed jointly with the Department of Primary Education and covered 555 government and 290 Rotary primary schools in 33 Districts of Dhaka and Rajshahi Divisions.
- Mobile Boat Clinic: The mobile clinic 'HASUK' on a self-propelled steel boat, was launched in 1997 under RI's matching grant program.
 It provided medical care, including dental and eye care facilities for 50-60 patients every day covering 68 villages in the marshy areas in Kishoreganj area. Rotary volunteer doctors from abroad provided their services in the project.



 Rotary Medical Centre: The project was founded by Rotary Club of Dhaka South West and Dhaka in 2000 with the support of RC Gilford in Nebraska, RID 3630. USA and Rotary Foundation. The project provides basic health care facilities from a two-storied building in a remote area Kishoreganj.



• Combating Covid 19: Bangladesh Rotary undertook massive humanitarian programs to provide ration and cooked food to hundreds and thousands people from low income group covering the entire country during one of the worst health crisis in the modern times. The program was participated by all Rotary clubs jointly with local government and municipalities, NGOs, corporate houses, philanthropical organisations and volunteers. Besides the Clubs distributed facemask, PPEs and other

bio-safety items to frontline service providers especially in public services like hospitals.

- Covid 19 Testing Laboratory: Rotary Dhakain response to the Covid -19 pandemic developed RT PCR SARS CoV2 Testing Laboratory at National Institute of Cancer Research and Hospital (NICRH) under Rotary Global Grant program (GG#2117971) for testing of patients undergoing treatment for Cancer in the hospital.
- High Flow Nasal Canola Project and beds for HDU: The Club jointly with RC Metropolitan also
 distributed High Flow Nasal Canola to Kurmitola General Hospital in Dhaka Cantonment and
 Kuwait-Bangladesh Maitri Hospital in Banani under two separate Rotary Global Grant programs
 for treatment of patients with Corona infections. The Club also provided beds high dependency
 unit (HDU) of Kurmitola General Hospital.

Apart from the major projects and programs. Rotary Clubs in Bangladesh have been a large number of projects and programs on regular basis in keeping with the Rotary's Six Focus Areas, which include –

A. Prevention of Diseases and Treatment:

• The first eye camp in the country was organized by RC Dhaka in 1961 with the support of IPAC (Australia) and BNSB (Bangladesh National Society for the Blinds). Since then hundreds of eye camps and dental camps are organized every year by Rotary Clubs benefitting thousands of people. The programs are supported by eye ad dental hospitals and NGOs with volunteer doctors from home and abroad. Programs for School Eye Examination (SEE) and Dental Care for children under ABCD (Auss Bangla Care for Dental) are organized regularly.



- Every year the Clubs organizes a number of health camps jointly with various hospitals and healthcare organizations providing basic and specialized treatment to mostly poor and vulnerable patients with limited access to formal healthcare faci8lities.
- Rotary Clubs in Bangladesh has been supplying medical and laboratory equipment including Ambu bags, medical gas analyzer, freezer, wheel chairs, ambulances, equipment & reagents to various hospitals and healthcare units including Bangabandhu Medical University, NICRH, Kumudini Hospital and others.
- The Clubs organizes awareness program for prevention of cancer and other life threatening diseases including HIV and AIDS.
- Cleft Lip and Plastic, including Burn reconstruction surgery was organized supported by Rotary Club of Neopean and Penrith of Australia.
- The prosthetic hand project was introduced, providing active functional hands jointly with LN4 of USA and CRP of Bangladesh.
- The Rotary Pacemaker Bank was formed in 2007 jointly by RC of Dhaka Buriganga, Dhaka Cosmopolitan, Dhaka Mid-city, Dhaka and Dilkusha and the Heartbeat International (a US based NGO) and National Heart Foundation.
- Over 150 patients was treated for Prolapse & VVF surgery from 2012-15 with support of volunteer doctors from DAK foundation of Australia.

B. Water and Sanitation:

- Every year hundreds of hand/shallow tube-wells are installed along with sanitary latrines keeping in view the overall improvement of hygiene and sanitation of the common people, especially in rural areas.
- Rotary has undertaken a program for mitigation of arsenic in Kushtia, Jessoe and other Arsenic affected areas in Bangladesh supported RI which contributed 500,000 US\$ in 1999-2000.



- An unique and pond filter was installed in Shayamnagar, Dhaka supplying pure drinking to an entire village affected by salinity.
- Rotary Dhaka has also initiated program distribution of re-usable sanitary napkins designed 'DAYS FOR GIRLS', an US based NGO. The program was introduced by RC Dhaka and Gulshan Green.

C. Maternal and Child Heath:

- Rotary organizes a number of FreeClinics for mother and child in the city slums and rural reas with volunteer doctors from home and abroad including NGOs. Hundreds of poor patients are benefitted from the clinics.
- Rotary supplied lifesaving medicine to Azimpur Mother and Child Health Training Institute and Hospital for treating pregnant women with child birth complications.
- Vaccination program for children against life threatening diseases are organised. RC Dhaka organized vaccination program against Pneumonia (HIB) jointly with 16 Rotary Clubs of Nagasaki, RID 2740 and Rotary Foundation.



D. Basic Education and Literacy:

- Rotary organize a number of literacy programs including running free community schools and education centre in bastes and rural areas.
- Textbooks, writing materials, backpack, computers, training aids and manuals, furniture, school bus, including school meals are supplied regularly. The Club also provides financial assistance to meritorious poor and underprivileged students.



E. Economic and Community Development:

- Since 1950s Rotary has been involved in relief and rehabilitation works and disaster management
 every year during flooding, cyclones and other natural disasters. In 1970s and 1980s, Rotary has
 rehabilitated hundreds of families with 'hoe for the homeless' program, including supply of
 agriculture implements, seeds, etc. fo people affected by tornadoes and floods including cyclones
 Sidre (in 2007) and Aila (in 2009).
- The first passenger shed for bus passengers in Dhaka was developed in 1955 in front of the Press Club in Topkhana.
- Tree plantation program is organized every year jointly with the Forest Department and the community. Thousands of tree saplings are planted every year creating definite impact on the environment.
- Low-cost shelters have been developed throughout Bangladesh with the support of Rotary Foundation and other Rotary Clubs.
- A large number of income generation programs are undertaken every year by the Rotary Clubs under micro-credit and self finance schemes in agriculture, fishery, poultry, cattle and goat farming besides programs are undertaken for distr8bution rickshaws and rickshaw vans, etc, for income generation with especial focus on underprivileged people.
- Special programs are undertaken for empowerment of women including skill development and literacy, awareness in hygiene and self-defiance, distribution of sewing machine for income generation, etc.
- Vocational training are organized for job creation that include training in garment-making under 'WCS' and other programs of the Foundations. A number of computer training centers have been set up for development of IT skill.
- Model villages Nanduine in Gazipur and Ramsera in Kushtia were set up for integrated rural development that include improvement of homes, schools and healthcare facility together with income generation programs in agriculture, fishery, livestock and poultry farming including training through micro-credit.
- Distribution of winter clothing, blankets, emergency food and medicine are organized every year among the underprivileged people mostly in remote areas.

F. Peace and Conflict Prevention/Resolution:

- In this world of numerous conflict zone Rotary plays a vital role in prevention of conflict and establishing peace around the world. Bangladesh Rotary has been actively participating in the RI initiative for Peace and Conflict Resolution, organizing various awareness programs.
- An RI Peace Award program was organized in 2013 to mark the 75 years Rotary in Bangladesh with Prime Minister as the Chief Guest.

Events and Programs:

 The Club regularly organizes events and programs jointly with the District and other Clubs and Rotarians. Such events and program are participated by Rotarians, countries Presidents, Prime Ministers, RI Presidents and dignitaries.





 The first RI Presidential Conference, organized by the Club on behalf of the District, was held in 2000 and participated by RI President Carlo Ravizza as the Chief Guest and Noble Laurette Professor M Yunus as key note speaker. The program included month long blood donation program and RYLA.

 The Centennial Bell Program, marking the 100th year of Rotary, was celebrated in 2005. The Bell was received by RC Dhaka. The program was participated by all Rotarians when the bell was taken round the country. The program concluded with fellowship diner participated by KallayanBannerjee (later RI President).



Rotary Club of Dhaka started its journey under Rotary International District (RID) 89 in 1937-38, covering Middle Asia

(withthe whole of British India, Bhutan, Ceylon and Burma)with Sir Phiroze Sethi as the first District Governor. Later the district was renumbered as RID 88.Subsequently, more districts were created with increasing number of Clubs. Rotary Dhaka in succession came under RIDs 89 (in 1937-38), 88 (in 1939-40), 90 (in 1938-40), 90 (in 1943-47), 91 (in 1946-47), 49 (in 1948-49), 53 (in 1949-50), 325 (in 1957-58), 310 (in 1966-67), 307 (in 1969-70), 325 (in 1971-72) and 329 (in 1977-78). From 1984-85, the District 328 was formed covering whole of Bangladesh with 40 Rotary Clubs. The district was re-numbered as RI District 3280 (in 1991-92), In 2013-14, with growing number of Clubs, the district was divided in two districts – RID 3281 and 3282.Rotary Dhaka came under RID 3281. 13 dedicated Rotarians from Rotary Dhaka have graced the offices of the District Governor.

Starting with 17 charter members back in 1937, Rotary Dhaka, as the mother of Rotary in Bangladesh,has sponsored 24 Rotary Clubs, 5 Rotaract and 2 Interact Clubsresulting in phenomenal growth of Rotary in Bangladesh in the last 84 years with a membership of over 10,000 Rotarians, 7,000 Rotaractors and 1,000 Interactors in over 450 Rotary Clubs, 330 Rotaract and 110 Interact Clubs in two Rotary Districts - 3281 and 3282. With the experience of World War II in 1939-45, the infamous Bengal famine in 1943-44, partition of South Asia in 1947, liberation of Bangladesh in 1971 and the present Noble Corona pandemic in 2020-21, Rotary Club of Dhaka – the GRAND NUMBER ONE – has passed through the test time with motivation and dedication to Rotary International motto 'SERVICE ABOVE SELF'.



The Swanirvar Rowmari

The Rowmari Community Corps (RCC) established in December 2014, by the two benevolent educated volunteers Mr. M.A Momen as President and Mr. Rofigul Alom

volunteers Mr. M.A Momen as President and Mr. Rofiqul Alom Shaheen as General Secretary with 22 members including President and General Secretary in Rowmari Upazila of Kurigram district. We all know Kurigram is one of the deprived and backward districts in Bangladesh. Rotary Club of Dhaka (RCD) has been supporting RCC since 2011. The supports were basically relief in terms of cash, supplies and construction materials. During the flood of 2014, RCD first came forward to assist RCC with development activities. With RCD, local administration, local colleges, schools and community leaders also put their hands in these noble causes.





The main objectives and aims of RCC; i) The overall improvement of the deprived and poor populations lives and establishing peace in the community. ii) Creating awareness among the people by providing correct and true information in raising their consciousness. iii) Through team building organizing the poor people for their own development. iv) Providing micro credit to the poor people especially widows, single headed women families, adolescent girls particularly those who are going to school/colleges to continue their education by lending interest free loans. RCC also provides training on various issues eg. Basic accounting, computer

literacy, health awareness and climate changes. One of the most priority actions is tree plantation.

This microcredit project is renamed as Shanirvar Rowmari, an economic development programme for short, medium and long term assistance to the neediest families, especially day labourers, widows, female headed families and old people. Since the beginning Taka 52 lacs have been revolving among 350+ beneficiaries. This year Rotary Club of Dhaka added tk15 lacs more, which brings the total Tk 67 lacs in the micro credit fund. RCC Rowmari is highly recognised by the Kurigram district social development team and Rowmari Upzilla administration, including health, DPHE, Education and Agricultural departments. As the RCC team is well trained and



strong team, it is very much possible for the club leaders to monitor projects remotely.



This was more evident during the COVID 19 Pandemic situation. This Sanirvar Rowmari Programme will be continued by RC Dhaka Club until the most deprived population of the Upazilla, "Stands on by themselves" and become a model area of Rotary.

The members of the club have decided to focus RCD intervention in Rowmari, where the need is grave, they planned for short and medium term assistance to the needlest families. RCD's intervention activities will be adopted as the situation of Covid 19 evolves. RCC requires additional fund approximately Tk.10 lakhs in phases.

Rotary Fight Against Corona Project (Hot Water Filter)


Kurmitola General Hospital is a unique and landmark Institute of Bangladesh government, established on 13 May 2012 as a tertiary care hospital. It is located in Dhaka cantonment area, Dhaka, the capital city of Bangladesh. The total size of this multistoried hospital building is 1,200,000 Sft whichconsists of 12 floors, each comprises 100,000 sft.(12 Floor X 100,000 Sft. = Total 1,200,000 Sft.) A large population of Dhaka north directly becomes benefited from its operation and in a short time it became a very popular and reliable heath care center to the people. In late 2019 theKurmitola General Hospital(KGH) dealt with 6,000 outpatient and 800 inpatients in a dayl. At the beginning of the 19 pandemic In 2020, within a thisGeneralHospitalwasconverted to COVID Hospital with the accommodation of more than 1,200 beds absolutely for COVID patients. To combat with COVID -19 infection KGH has been working as a dedicated Hospital.

Statistical analysis of the number of COVID treated patients at KGH showed that during the period of March, 2020 to 16 May 2021 there werea number of 26,648AdmittedPatients and 58,500 Outdoor patients.

Capacity of the hospital: the hospital has the capacity to deal with about 5,000Out Patientsin a day and 1,200 Inn Patients with27 ICU and HDU is being built up by Rotary Clubs and TRF: 10 Bed trough 3 Rotary GG in RY 2020-21.

Human Resource: Total 1,134 as such Doctors: 306,

Nurses: 400, with other Supporting Staff: 428 (Medical/ Technical: 315 & Non-Medical/ Non-Technical 113) lead by Management Team headed by a Director, a Brigadier General of Bangladesh Army who is to be aMedical Doctor. Table 1

Bayezidur Rahman MPHF made call with the kind cooperation of Rtn PP Md. AH Zahidul Islam Romel PHF B MD, RCU and Rtn PP Dr Niaz A Rahman PHF B MD. We could arrange 7 of requested type water dispensers with great thanks to the Sponsors as follows with very negotiated price of Tk. 31,000/= each Totaling Tk. 210,000/= under "Rotary Fight Against Corona" project". PDG Safina Rahman, PHF B MD PHS had a very active role in this project and she had motivated some Clubs and hopes to arrange other 3 of such type water filters in the very near future.

৩৪০০ মিটার উচ্চতায় অবস্থিত নামচেকে বলা হয় শেরপাদের রাজধানী। নেপালের সোলুখুন্তু জেলার প্রধান শহর এটি| কি নেই এখানে? পর্বতপ্রেমীদের ভিড়ে মুখরিত থাকে নামচে বাজার।

মাথাব্যাথার মধ্যেও সে পথ ধরে যেতে একটা অন্যরকম ভালোলাগা কাজ করছিলো, চারদিক সবুজ, হালকা ঠাণ্ডা ঝিরঝিরে বিশুদ্ধ বাতাস। ঢাকার মত শহর থেকে যাবার পর বাতাসের বিশুদ্ধতাটা কেমন আলাদা করে অনুভূত হয়, কি যে একটা ভালোলাগা!

লুকলার ঠিক পরেই চেপ্লং, ওখানে একটা সাসপেনশান ব্রীজ পার হতে হয়। আমার জন্যে এটা প্রথম কোন সাসপেনশান ব্রীজ পার হওয়া। একসাথে কজন পার হলে কেমন দুলতে থাকে, একটা ছমছম অনুভূতি কিন্তু ভালো লাগে।




এর পরের জায়গাটার নাম ঘাট। এই জায়গাটা অনেকটা সমতল। পথের পাশে কি সুন্দর শাকসবজি আর ফুলের বাগান। ঘাট থেকে ঘণ্টা খানেক হাঁটার পর আমরা ফাকদিং পৌঁছুলাম। প্রথমদিনের বিশ্রাম এবং রাত্রিযাপন ছিল এখানেই।

শরীর যদিও অনেক ক্লান্ত ছিল কিন্তু ঘুমটা ঠিকমত যুতসই হলোনা। আমরা সমতলের মানুষ, হঠাৎ করে ২৬০০ মিটার উচ্চতায় ঘুমটা ঠিকমত আসতে চায় না।

পরদিন সকালে নাস্তা সেরে আমাদের দ্বিতীয় দিনের পথ চলা শুরু করলাম। এটা ছিল সবচেয়ে পরিশ্রমসাধ্য পথ। ফাকদিং থেকে নামচে বাজার, ২৬০০ মিটার থেকে ৩৪০০ মিটার পথ আরোহণ করতে হবে। প্রায় ৭.৫ কিলোমিটার পথের পুরোটাই ওপরে ওঠা। নামচে পর্যন্ত যেতে পথে আরও তিনটি জায়গা, বেংকার, মানজো এবং জোড়েসাল।

মানজোতে গিয়ে একটা ছোট্ট বিরতি, ট্র্যাকিং পাস নেবার জন্যে| সাগরমাথা ন্যাশনাল পার্ক, ইউনেস্কো ঘোষিত হ্যারিটেজ সাইট। এখানে ট্র্যাকিংয়ের জন্যে প্রবেশকালে অনুমতি নিতে হয়। মাউন্ট এভারেস্ট হচ্ছে এই সাগরমাথা ন্যাশনাল পার্কের অধীনে।

মানজো থেকে একটু সামনে আগালে দুধকোশি নদীর ওপর আরেকটা সাসপেনশান বীজ এবং এই বীজটা পার হলেই ছোট্ট গ্রাম জোরেসালে! এই গ্রামটি কখনো নিস্তব্ধ থাকেনা কারণএর পাশ দিয়ে বয়ে গেছে দুধকোশী নদী। পাহাড়ী খরস্রোতা নদী, তাই সবসময় উচ্ছ্বল, সবসময় মুখরিত। ডানে দুধকোশিকে রেখে আমরা জোরেসালের মধ্যে দিয়ে আগাচ্ছিলাম।

Understanding Rotary

All Rotarians throughout the world pride themselves to be part of a unique Global Organization which has roots in nearly all countries of the world. Since its humble beginnings in 1905 Rotary created numerous world leaders and globally took up significant projects in all walks of life, many of which will forever be milestones in the history of mankind.

Rotary is a non-political and non-religious organization open to all. There are over 35,000 member clubs worldwide, with a membership of 1.2 million individuals, known as Rotarians.[1]

But how canone describe this organization called "Rotary"? There are so many characteristics of a Rotary Club: features of service, internationality, fellowship, classifications of each vocation, development of goodwill and world understanding, the emphasis of high ethical standards, concern for other people an many more descriptive qualities.

In 1976 the Rotary International Board of Directors was interested in creating a concise definition of the fundamental aspects of Rotary. After numerous drafts, a committee of three selected Rotarians of Rotary's Public Relation Committee.presented this definition, which has been used ever since in various Rotary publications:

"Rotary is an organization of business and professional person united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build goodwill and peace in the world." Those 31 words are the essence of Rotary.[2]

The Object of Rotary is "to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise". The statement then lists four areas by which this "ideal of service" is fostered:

- a) through the development of acquaintance as the opportunity for service;
- b) the promotion of high ethical standards in business and professions;
- c) through service in one's personal, business and community life;
- d) advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace.

THE 4-WAY TEST

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary "4-Way Test." It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 when he was asked to take charge of the Chicago based Club Aluminum Company, which was facing bankruptcy. Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company and drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow in their business and professional lives. The 4-Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company was credited to this simple philosophy.

Herb Taylor became president of Rotary International during 1954-55. The 4-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 and has been translated into more than 100 languages and published in thousands of ways. The message should be known and followed by all Rotarians.

"Of the things we think, say or do:

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?"[

In our daily professional and personal life, if we can ask ourselves these four questions and act accordingly then the world would surely be a much better place to live.

Why is Rotary a unique organization? It is so because Rotary has certain distinctive features, first and foremost is the membership criteria. Only invited professionals are eligible to seek membership in a club and the person must be a professional of good standing in the community. To be finally eligible for membership, the invited person has to attend several weekly meetings to get to know what this organization is like and the other members has a chance to know the person. Finally with the consent of the board and no objection of all the members, a person is



inducted. On the other hand, the vocation or profession or the person is vitally important. Membership is based on the Classification principle which recognized business or professional service which the Rotarian renders to society. Classifications are determined by activities or services to society rather than by the position held by a particular individual. In other words, if a person is the president of a bank, he or she is not classified as "bank president" but under the classification "banking." In the past one member of each profession could be inducted in a Club so that in a Club there is representation from a variety of professions. Though the classification principle is not as dominant as it once was, it is still important that we make an effort to assure that each Rotary Club represents a cross section of the business and professional service of the community.^[2]

AVENUES OF SERVICE

Rotary is a voluntary service organization which has specific guiding principles which include the Four-Way Test (Truth, Fairness, Goodwill and Friendship) Other principals involve Rotary's commitment to Service above Self, which is channeled through Five Avenues of Servicewhich form the foundation of club activity.

- · Club Service focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the effective functioning of the club.
- Vocational Service encourages Rotarians to serve others through their vocations and to practice high ethical standards
- Community Service covers the projects and activities the club undertakes to improve life in its community.
- International Service encompasses actions taken to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the globe and to promote world understanding and peace.
- New Generations recognizes the positive change implemented by youth and young adults through leadership development activities

Rotary clubs serve communities around the world, each with unique concerns and needs. Rotarians have continually adapted and improved the way they respond to those needs, taking on a broad range of service projects. The most successful and sustainable Rotary service tends to fall within one of the following six areas:

- · Peace and conflict prevention/resolution
- · Disease prevention and treatment
- · Water and sanitation
- · Maternal and child health
- · Basic education and literacy
- · Economic and community development

Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation recognize these six areas of focus as organizational priorities, and there are countless ways that Rotarians can address these needs locally and internationally.^[5]

BUILDING UP ONESELF

As I gradually understood Rotary, I found that another unique feature of this organization is that Rotary helps each and every member to build up their own professional and personal acumen. To my knowledge this is the only organization which has strict guidelines on how to execute the office responsibilities. Every member of a newly elected board of directors has to attend training courses on how to conduct club activities for the year when they will hold office. Through the years, as one takes various positions in the club as committee chair, treasurer, secretary, president, board member etc, Rotary gradually guides and teaches the individual as to how to be good at the position and eventually the individual becomes a strong professional. This is such an excellent way of training individuals to build up their own expertise to be used in their own professional and personal life. To achieve this, Rotary International has detailed training manuals and every year conduct courses in every district which the club officials must attend. These 'free' courses are of such high quality that to avail similar, one has to enroll in a university or management courses at huge expenses. On the other hand, through weekly fellowship meetings and participating in service projects, Club members learn how to work amicably and interact with their peers and be a better human being.



THE ROTARY FOUNDATION (TRF)

Lastly, I want to touch upon TRF.

The Rotary Foundation is a <u>non-profit</u> corporation that supports the efforts of <u>Rotary International</u> to achieve world understanding and peace through international humanitarian, educational, and cultural exchange programs. It is supported solely by voluntary contributions.

The Foundation was created in 1917 by Rotary International's sixth president, Arch C. Klumph, as an endowment fund for Rotary "to do good in the world." It has grown from an initial contribution of US\$26.50 to more than US\$1billion. It has one of the largest and most prestigious international fellowship programs in the world.^[3]

FEW IMPORTANT FACTS

- The Foundation is supported solely by voluntary contributions.
- It was created in 1917 by Rotary International's sixth president, Arch C. Klumph, as an endowment fund for Rotary"to do good in the world."
- It has grown from an initial contribution of US\$26.50 to more than US\$3billion.
- · TRF is one of the largest donor organizations in the world.
- TRF has received the best scores of all charity organizations in the world for last many years with 99.16% Financial rating and 100% Accountability & Transparency.

The funds raised in TRF is distributed throughout the world to Rotary Clubs taking on worthy humanitarian projects through Global Grants, These Grants have specific guidelines and are strictly monitored to give a 100% transparency. Of any donor fund, throughout the world, TRF Grants has the highest ratio of utilization in projects as in Rotary the overhead expenses are minimum and there is nearly 90% utilization.

CONCLUSION

Rotary is a great organization, an organization of a lifetime. It is a fraternity of global friends and professionals with the motto of 'Service above Self'. The support one gets from fellow Club members to members of other clubs to Rotarians of different countries is incomparable. Rotarians become part of a lifetime family. Apart from the few aspects of Rotary mentioned above there are many others which encompasses a wide variety of social and professional walks of life. Rotary lets one unleash hidden potentials and be a better professional, a better human being and gives one the opportunity to effectively serve humanity.

To be eligible for the Rotary Citation, clubs need to begin the year as active clubs in good standing – or having paid each invoice balance in full upon receipt. To verify that your club is in good standing, check your daily club balance report under Club Administration > Club Finances. You should have an outstanding balance of \$0.00. Invoices are due when they are posted, in mid-January and mid-July.

Rotary club leaders can go into Rotary Club Central and select at least 13 out of 25 goals they wish to apply toward citation achievement. This flexibility allows clubs to choose the goals that are most relevant and achievable. In addition, many goals will be self-reported by marking "achieved" in Rotary Club Central.

To achieve the citation:

- Review the 25 available goals
- Select at least 13 goals (or more than 50% of the available goals)
- Achieve those goals
- Report achievement in Rotary Club Central

Once you are in Rotary Club Central, navigate to the **Goal Center**, select the **year**, and click on the **All tab** to see the goals.
